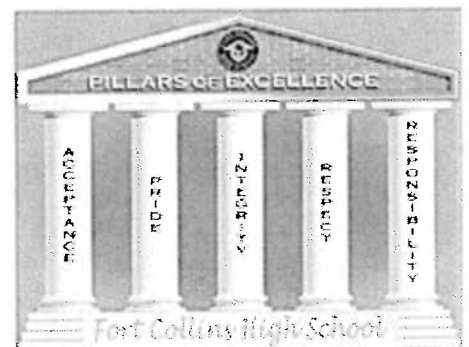

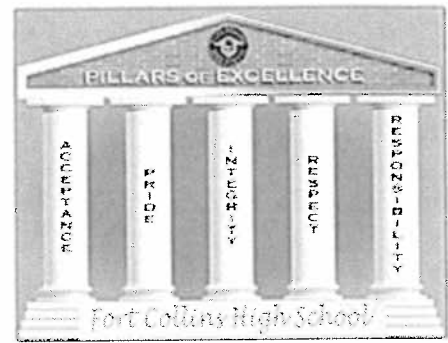

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Signori is available to all 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade men. Membership in this choir introduces students to basic concepts of tone production and music literacy as well as choral literature from Medieval to Modern styles for men's voices.

OBJECTIVES:

Instruction in this course will focus on the following teaching and learning objectives:

- Developing correct vocal techniques
- Developing fundamental music skills in notation and sight-singing
- Recognizing musical elements and demonstrate expressive qualities in varying styles of choral music
- Contributing to the blend, balance, and quality of the ensemble by developing the ability to sing a part confidently
- Developing performance confidence
- Gaining opportunities for the enjoyment of music through active participation
- Developing self-discipline by functioning as a responsible member of the ensemble
- Developing personal character traits of leadership, poise, and dependability as well as provide an avenue for self-expression
- Developing a desire to continue musical experiences

ESSENTIAL LEARNINGS:

At the conclusion of this course, the student will be able to describe, define, and vocally demonstrate:

1. Basic Rhythmic Patterns
2. Basic Harmony - notes, keys, intervals/ear training, intonation, scales
3. Basic Nomenclature - musical terms, symbols, form
4. Technique - healthy vocal production
5. Musicality - articulation, phrasing, tone
6. Ensemble Performance - balance, blend, intonation
7. Musical Styles - history, styles

COURSE LEVEL:

This course is open to all freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and seniors. There are no prerequisites.

COURSE CONTENT:

Course content will be presented through carefully chosen literature as well as audio-visual materials and occasional outside clinicians who will focus on different aspects of choral singing. Our music will be the primary material for this course, but other sources, including YouTube videos, online listening, and class handouts will be assigned as appropriate.

COURSE INSTRUCTION:

Instruction in Men's Choir is primarily through active student participation and discussion, however other methods of instruction will be utilized. Those methods include, but are not limited to, lecture, group projects, and audio-video presentation.

GRADES:

Letter grades are earned by the student based upon the following percentage of possible points: 100-90% = A, 89-80% = B, 79-70% = C, 69-60% = D, >60% = Failure. Total points possible include numerical evaluations for attendance/participation, performances, homework, in-class assignments, and musical skill evaluations. Concerts will be weighted at 50%, Participation at 35%, and Assessments/Assignments at 15%.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES – (students will adhere to all FCHS policies and the Poudre School District “Code of Conduct” at all times to include, but not be limited to, the following):

1. **Attendance** – Students must attend class to receive the greatest benefit from instruction and class interaction. All choral rehearsals are spontaneous and impossible to recreate for individual students. Nevertheless, students with excused absences will be allowed to make up work (including participation points) according to Poudre School District policy. It is the student's responsibility to contact the instructor – outside of class – to complete missed assignments. Unless prior approval is granted by the instructor, late work will not be accepted.
2. **Participation** – Each student is responsible for participating in rehearsals, class discussions and contributing to the learning environment of the class. In order to fulfill his/her responsibility, it is necessary to be in class, on time with all materials, including music, paper and a writing instrument.
3. **Assignments** – Students are responsible for coming to class prepared. All assignments are due at the start of the class on the date the assignment is due. Please consult the Blackboard Class Calendar for all due dates.
4. **Food, Drink, Chewing Gum, Hats, etc.** – Food, drink and gum are not allowed in class, but water is permissible. Hats are to be removed when crossing the threshold of the classroom and are not to be worn at any time when you are in the classroom. The classroom is a formal setting and calls for a dignified presence, including adherence to the school dress code.
5. **Electronic Devices** – No electronic device of any kind may be used in class without permission. Electronic devices will be confiscated on the first offense and given to the office for disciplinary action. The presence of an electronic device during a test or quiz will be considered *prima facie* evidence of academic dishonesty.
6. **Final Examination** – Failure to take the final examination may result in a failing grade for this class.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY:

Each student is required to do his/her own work. Plagiarism and/or cheating will not be tolerated, and if detected, will result in disciplinary referral and action. The Fort Collins Student Handbook outlines the consequences for cheating and plagiarism, and the instructor will, with the assistance of an administrator, implement the policy. A first incident of plagiarism and/or cheating will result in a zero. Additional incidents may result in expulsion from school. Please consult the Handbook for the full text of the consequences for academic dishonesty.
